Regina Cœli (Queen of Heaven) is one of the four Marian antiphons; hymns to the Virgin Mary. The text involves an affirmation of the resurrection of Jesus. Legend has it that St Gregory the Great heard angels chanting the first three lines of the hymn one Easter morning in Rome, while following barefoot in a great religious procession the icon of the Virgin painted by Luke the Evangelist. He was thereupon inspired to add a fourth line to the hymn.

Mass in C by Beethoven was composed in 1807, to a commission from Prince Nikolaus Esterházy. The work is often overshadowed by his immense *Missa Solemnis*, written some fifteen years later. Many, however, consider the *Mass in C* to be the superior work.

Schicksalslied (Song of Destiny) is a short, powerful work for chorus and orchestra composed by Johannes Brahms between 1868 and 1871. The text is that of Friedrich Hölderlin's poem *Hyperions Schicksalslied*. Brahms discovered the text in an early volume of Hölderlin's verse, and immediately began sketching a setting, although it took him several years to complete it. The poem describes the bliss of the gods and the sufferings of humankind.

Each Thursday evening since January, our Chancel Choir has been dividing its rehearsal time. From 8pm to 9pm, guests join them and they become the *Glen Ridge Choral Society*. The next hour the Chancel Choir alone rehearses its music for the Sunday worship services. It is a difficult schedule to balance, but they've done an admirable job. Please show your support of our dedicated choir and our very own concert series by attending! Consider treating a friend! What a great way to introduce someone to Glen Ridge Congregational Church in a completely non-threatening way. Tickets will be on sale during coffee hour the next two Sundays.

SAM DOBBS Interprets Gen. 17:1-7, 15-16

To me this passage means that God made a covenant with Abram and promised to make him the father of many nations. However, Abram had to be very faithful and believe that God would fulfill the promise. God wanted Abram to live a pure life and be completely dedicated to him. If he did not, he would not receive the covenant's benefits. God changed Abram's name to Abraham, which means 'father of many.' Eventually the promise was fulfilled and Abraham became the spiritual father of all who believe. He also changed Sari's name to Sarah which means 'princess.' The name change was another sign of God's fulfillment of the covenant. This passage shows that in our personal relationships with God we must remain faithful to realize his full grace. We must try every day to strengthen our covenant with God and have a better relationship with him.
